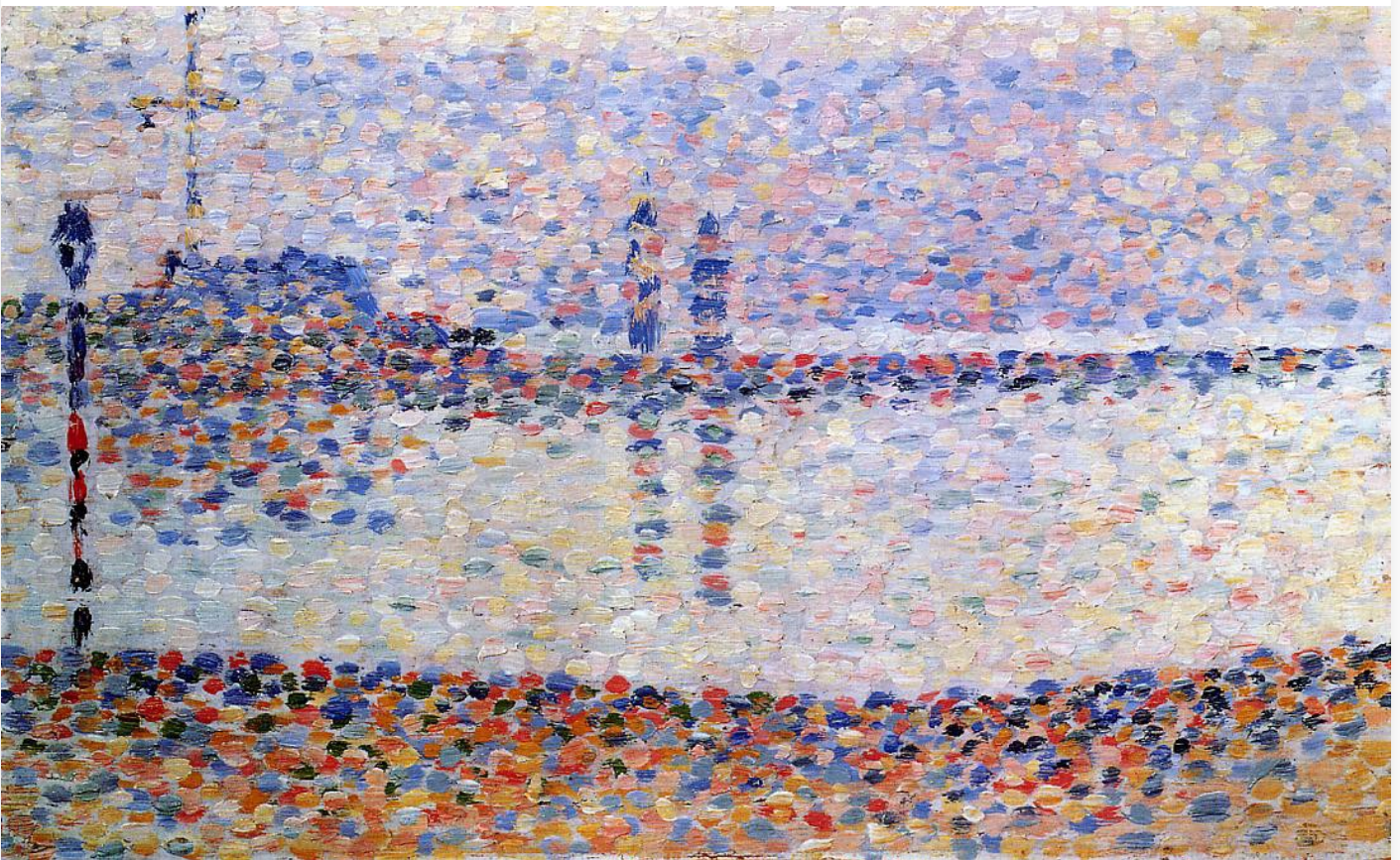

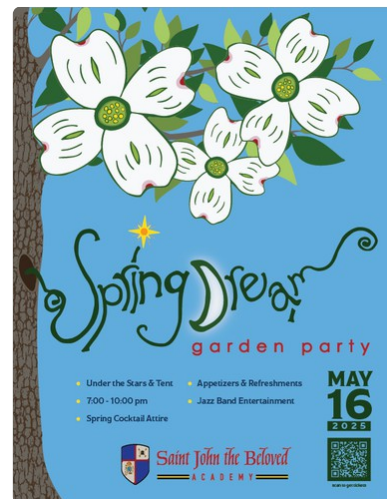

Grammar and Mechanics Essentials Program

Ms. Margaret Fagan is offering a **Grammar and Mechanics Essentials Program** after school for students in 4th - 8th grades.

The program will be from 3:10 - 4:30 p.m. on **Tuesdays for 4th - 5th grades** and **Thursdays for 6th - 8th grades**. There are two sessions available:

- **Session one is 4 weeks, (April 8th - May 1st).** Topics include: understanding parts of speech, phrases, basic diagramming, periods, capitalization rules, complete sentences.
- **Session two is 4 weeks, (May 6th - May 29th).** Topics include: understanding clauses, predicates, verb types, basic diagramming, comma use, reading comprehension.

Attendance Procedures

When a student is going to be arriving late, leaving early, or has a change in their pick-up routine, please email Mrs. Monica Stilson in the attendance office: attendance@stjohnacademy.org and copy Mrs. Gracia Escudero in the front office: gescudero@stjohnacademy.org and copy the homeroom teacher.

Just a reminder, that when students leave school during the day due to illness, appointment or any other reason, they must be called for in the School Health Room or the school office. Children may never wait outside the buildings to be picked up during school hours, nor may teachers release a child directly from the classroom.

A note, email, or phone call should be sent to school requesting early dismissal and stating the time and identifying the person who will pick-up the child. Persons picking up a child at a time other than dismissal should report to the school front office and sign the child out. The school staff will call the child in his/her classroom to come to the office to meet the person picking

him/her up. Students will not be called in advance to the nurse's office for an early release. Persons picking up a child may not go to the classroom.

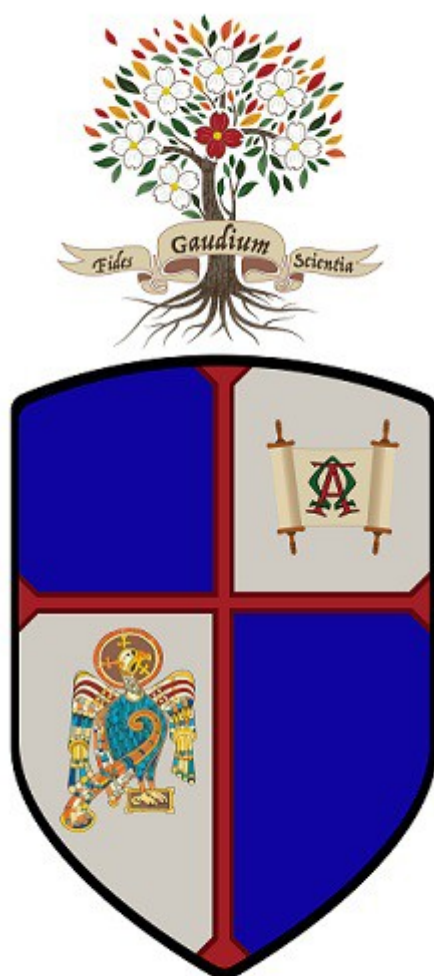
