

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
CORE ELEMENTS FOR RISING 6TH GRADERS

Spiritual


• Read these Gospel selections focused on the journey of Jesus and the disciples to Emmaus and the miracle at the wedding feast of Cana.



- **Reflect on John 2: 1-11**, The miracle at the wedding feast of Cana. What does the passage suggest about Mary and her personality? Why did Jesus resist? Do you think Mary sensed that this event would change her own relationship with Jesus as perhaps his life would take on a much more public dimension?

Also view Caravaggio's painting "Supper at Emmaus" and the "Marriage at Cana" by Jan Cornelisz Vermeyen to help you enter the scene of those moments.
